



MOUNTING SUGGESTIONS:

Ducati Scrambler 2015-2016 One-piece Seat

Hardware: *none*

Tools needed: Ignition key

Removal of Stock Seat:

1. Insert the ignition key into the lock under the left side of the rear fender and turn clockwise to release the rear latch.

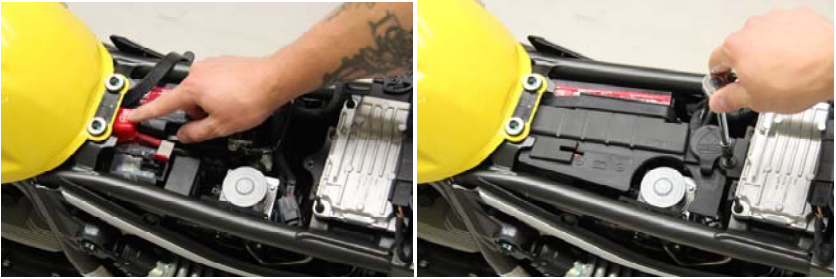


2. Lift the seat up and back to remove it from the motorcycle.

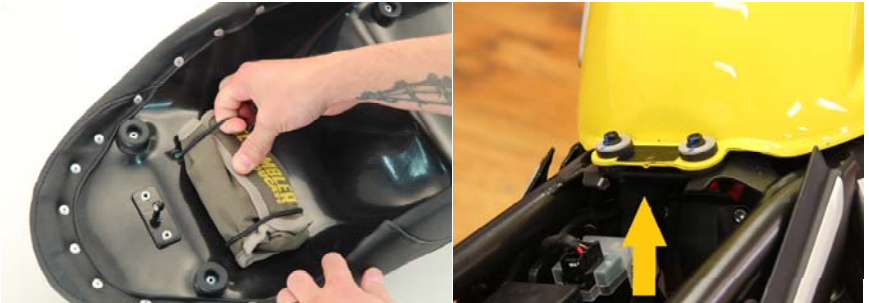


Installation of Mustang Seat:

Note: Before installing the Mustang seat, ensure the rubber cover is over the positive battery terminal and the battery cover is properly installed and in place. **Do not attempt to install the seat if these covers are missing, damaged or removed.**



1. Transfer the tool kit from the stock seat to the Mustang seat.



2. Insert the front tab of the Mustang seat into the mount behind the fuel tank.



3. Lower the seat onto the rear fender, align the pin with the latch on the fender, and press down firmly until a click is heard, signifying the seat is latched. Ensure this connection is secure before riding the motorcycle.
